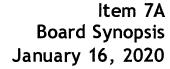

#### 1. ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Motion:

Approving Contract Change Order No. 6 to the Raw Water Pump Station, Phase 1 Construction Project with C. Overaa Construction in the amount of \$226,662 and a twenty-one (21) calendar day time extension associated with implementing a modified Ground Improvement System.

#### 2. **DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:**

On March 1, 2018, the SRWA Board approved an agreement with C. Overaa Construction (Overaa) for construction of the Raw Water Pump Station, Phase 1 Construction Project (Project) in the amount of \$6,634,000 and authorized the General Manager to sign any related documents and approve change orders in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 for a single change order or \$400,000 for a cumulative change order. Additionally, the Board appropriated \$7,297,400 to account number 950-53-552.51801\_001 "SRWA Wet Well Construction — Construction Contract" (Contract) for the construction agreement to be funded via contributions from SRWA participating agencies as outlined in the Raw Water Pump Station Phase 1 Funding Agreement.

Due to proximity to the Tuolumne River, the Project specifications required Overaa to design, furnish and install a complete and functional ground improvement system capable of maintaining a dry excavation to facilitate construction of a wetwell structure. Overaa chose to design and install a ground freezing system utilizing brine and relied upon reports regarding existing subsurface soil conditions provided by the SRWA. After installing the ground freezing system and operating the system for the intended design freeze period, groundwater continued to infiltrate the excavation. Ground temperature readings around the perimeter of the excavation indicated unfrozen "windows" determined to be pathways for groundwater intrusion impeding the excavation operation. Overaa claimed a differing site condition and, after consultation with the SRWA, chose to supplement its ground freezing effort with liquid nitrogen which is capable of a much lower freeze temperature than the initial brine-only system to close the "windows". This approach proved to be successful in achieving a dry excavation and excavation work was then subsequently completed. The design and installation of the nitrogen freeze system added 21 days to the project work time. The cost to implement the nitrogen freeze system, and associated twenty-one (21) calendar day time extension, is the basis for this change order.

The validity of cost and time extension associated with his change order were verified and recommended for approval by the Inferrera Construction Management Group, Inc. serving as Construction Manager under contract with the SRWA.

#### 3. FISCAL IMPACT / BUDGET AMENDMENT:

To date, a total of five (5) change orders have been processed in the amount of \$70,926. This change order, if approved, increases the Project cost to \$6,931,588, which is within the Project appropriation of \$7,297,400; therefore, no budget amendment is required.

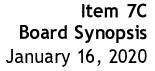
Overaa claims a differing site condition that affected their ability to develop a freeze wall based on the design provided by their subcontractor (Soilfreeze). Their claim is documented in Potential Change Order 5.0 dated February 22, 2019. This claim was rejected by the SRWA in a letter from ICM to Overaa dated April 26, 2019 due to the lack of physical evidence supporting their claim.

Further investigations to validate a claim of a differing site condition due to the existence of washed gravel lenses were conducted by Overaa. Physical samples of these lenses were obtained by Overaa under ICM's oversight and subsequently sent for lab analysis to verify that these soils exhibited a higher transmissivity rate than adjacent soils and as described in the background soils reports. These higher transmissive soils are evidence of a differing subsurface conditions and produced "windows" in SoilFreeze's ground freeze wall that allowed groundwater to pass through the otherwise frozen wall. The location of the washed gravel lenses corresponded with the "windows" both in elevation and horizontal location. Based on this evidence, SRWA agree to proceed with this CPR20 to compensate Overaa for their efforts to overcome the differing site condition that led to a successful freeze wall and subsequent excavation free of groundwater intrusion.

This Change Proposal Request 20 is full compensation for Overaa's additional efforts to establish a freeze wall that exceeded their initial design estimate due to soils encountered that differed materially than those described in the project documents.

#### 1. ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Resolution: Appropriating \$6,000 to account number 950-53-552.43332 "Permitting"

and \$2,700 to account number 950-53-552.47040\_000 "Dues" to provide additional funding for expenditures which were not anticipated when the 2019-20 budget was prepared. The funding for the appropriations will be

shared equally by the Cities of Ceres and Turlock.

## 2. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:

When the SRWA budget for fiscal year 2019-20 was prepared, the amounts budgeted for Permitting fees and Dues were based on prior year information. The requested increase in the budget for permitting fees is due to (1) an increase in the permitting fees for water systems charged by the State Water Resources Control Board, and (2) permitting fees associated with an amendment to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife Streambed Alteration Agreement permit as a result of a nesting Swainson's hawk in the exclusion zone during wetwell construction activities.

The increase in dues is related to membership in the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA). Dues are calculated by ACWA based on revenues reported by an agency in their prior year financial statements. The SRWA General Manager discussed the dues increase with ACWA staff and determined SRWA had been invoiced incorrectly since SRWA joined ACWA in 2017. The current membership fee of \$3,680 is in accordance with ACWA's published dues schedule. The TAC recommends continued membership in ACWA for the educational, networking and water policy advocacy benefits provided by ACWA's statewide efforts.

#### 3. FISCAL IMPACT / BUDGET AMENDMENT:

Staff is requesting the following budget amendments:

- ✓ Appropriate \$6,000 to account number 950-53-552.43332 "Permitting"; and
- ✓ Appropriate \$2,700 to account number 950-53-552.47040 000 "Dues".

The fiscal impact is an increase in the 2019-20 budget for the SRWA by \$8,700 which will be funded equally by the Cities of Ceres and Turlock.
