2. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:

In accordance with Article VII (F) of the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA), the Governing Board of the Stanislaus Regional Water Authority (SRWA) is hereby presented with the proposed 2019-20 annual budget for the SRWA. The proposed budget is prepared based on the estimated unexpended balance of the SRWA's existing contracts plus estimated administrative costs for 2019-20 based on how those functions are currently being executed.

In addition to the unexpended balance of previously approved contracts, the proposed budget contains an appropriation for the SRWA's payment to the Turlock Irrigation District for SRWA's share of the pre-existing infiltration gallery construction costs in accordance with Section 7d of the 2015 Water Sales Agreement. There will be other contracts, most significantly the SRWA Regional Surface Water Supply Project (Regional Facilities), or expenditures the Board will be asked to consider in 2019-20 as the project progresses. Any budget implications of these items will include a budget amendment request at that time.

Article XV(F) of the Joint Powers Agreement states that the following regarding SRWA's cash reserves:

The Governing Board shall determine on an annual basis, prior to the beginning of each fiscal year, a level of reasonable cash reserves to be accumulated by the Authority. This reserve shall be accumulated from revenues collected in excess of all actual costs of the Authority. Once the targeted reserve level is reached, all additional revenues collected in excess of the actual costs of the Authority shall be considered excess revenue and, subject to any limitation in any bond or other financing agreement, carried forward as revenue for the next fiscal year and serve to reduce each Participant's respective assessment for such subsequent fiscal year.

As part of the 2017-18 and 2018-19 budgets, Staff recommended and the Board approved a minimum cash reserve sufficient to fund 3 months of projected expenditures. This process has worked well over the past two years. Staff is currently working with the SRWA's legal counsel to develop an agreement for cost sharing processes and procedures prior to entering into the Regional Facilities construction phase. As part of this agreement, Staff anticipates continuing to send each participating agency an invoice for three (3) months projected cashflow needs at the beginning of each calendar quarter.

3. FISCAL IMPACT / BUDGET AMENDMENT:

The proposed 2019-20 annual budget for the SRWA totals \$8,523,656. The following summarizes the major components of the 2019-20 proposed budget:

Accepting a permanent non-exclusive easement and temporary construction easement from the City of Ceres for the purpose of constructing a finished water pipeline and conveying potable water from the SRWA Water Treatment Plant to the City of Ceres Terminal

Reservoir.

2. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:

The SRWA will own, operate and maintain a finished water pipeline conveying potable drinking water from the SRWA Water Treatment Plant to the City of Ceres terminal reservoir located north of Hatch Road and east of Eastgate Boulevard. The point of interconnection between the SRWA regional water facilities and the Ceres water supply system will be the point at which the finished water pipeline enters the City terminal reservoir. Most of the pipeline to Ceres will be located within the Hatch Road right-of-way. However, SRWA needs an easement on City land from the point where the pipeline leaves the road right-of-way to the Ceres reservoir. SRWA and Ceres therefore have prepared proposed easements across the City property. The permanent non-exclusive easement is located on A.P.N. 039-012-014 and consists of approximately 0.59 acres. The temporary construction easement is located on this same parcel and is approximately 0.36 acres.

3. FISCAL IMPACT / BUDGET AMENDMENT:

These easements are being granted by the City of Ceres to the SRWA at no cost and no filing fees in accordance with Government Code 6103.

4. GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

Recommend adopting a resolution to accept these easements to facilitate the construction and operation and maintenance of the Ceres Finished Water Pipeline.

5. ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:

N/A

6. ALTERNATIVES:

The City of Ceres has identified the terminal reservoir location and these easements are therefore required to construct, operate and maintain a pipeline to serve finished water provided by the SRWA. The most efficient pipeline routing to the terminal reservoir is through this easement. Alternative pipeline routes would result in increased construction costs to the City of Ceres.

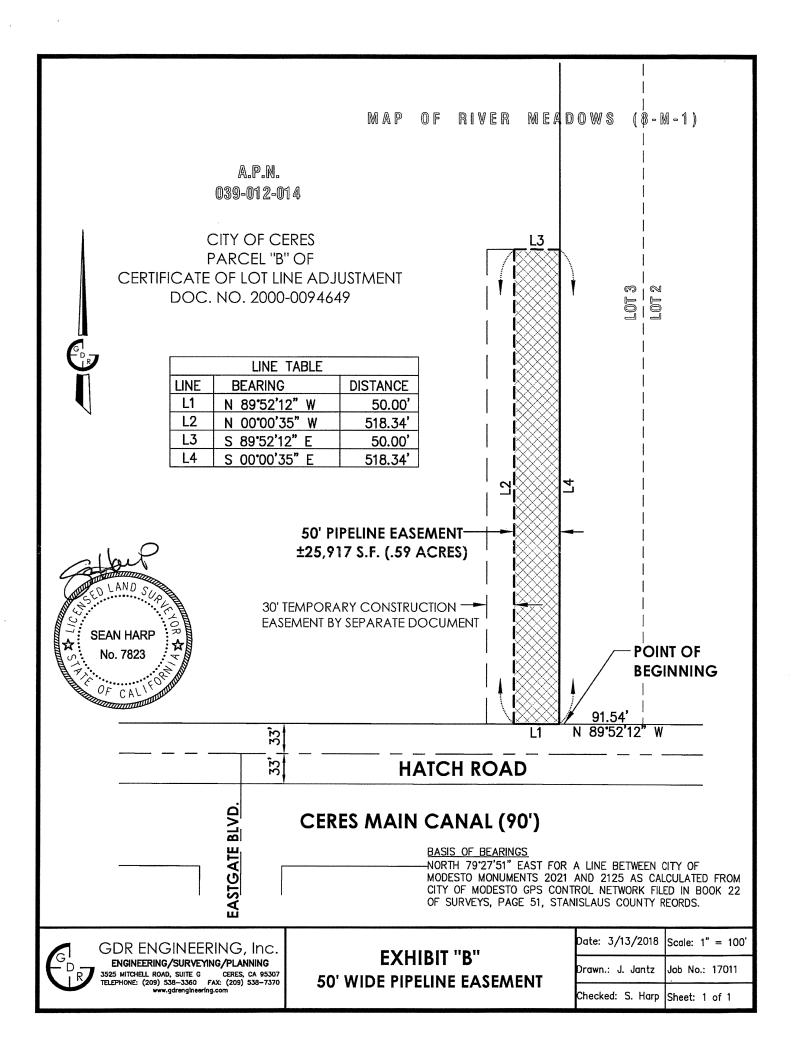

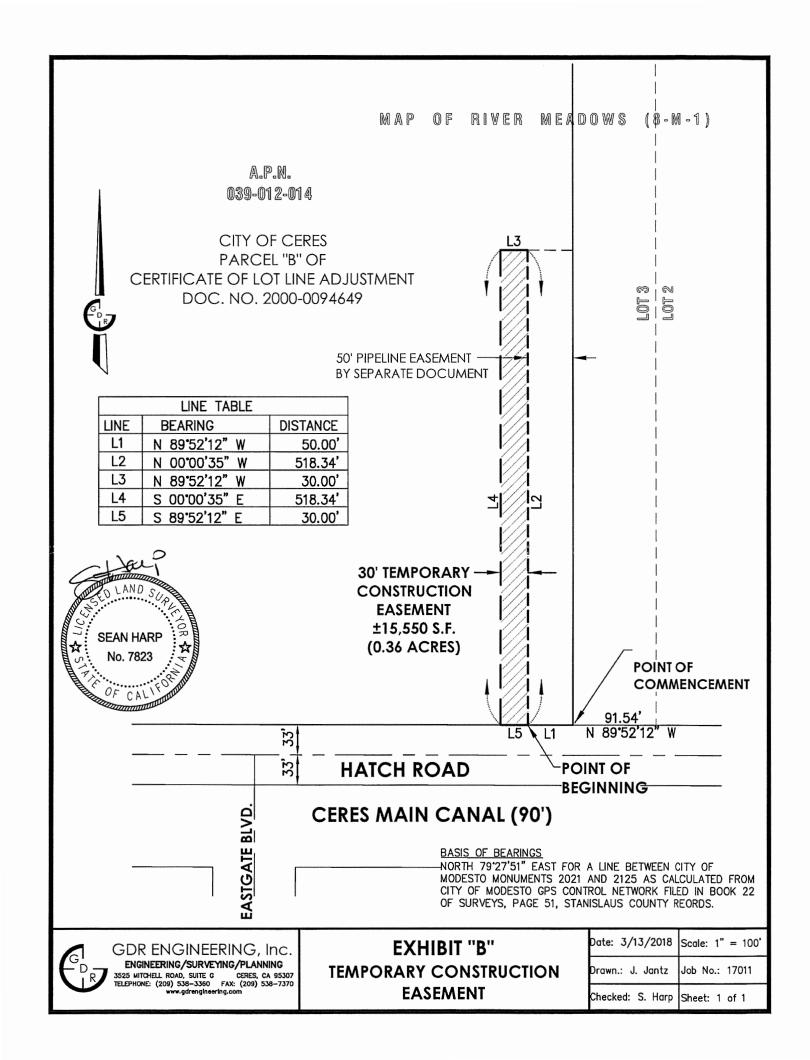
